

Florence Noble, is director of research at the CNRS, and director of the CNRS unit "Pharmacology and addiction therapies" (CNRS ERL3649), University of Paris.

She is conducting experimental research on drug addiction since the late 90s. Her team is nationally and internationally recognized as an expert in the pharmacotherapies of addiction. She is regularly invited as speaker to give conferences on neurobiology of addiction and pharmacotherapies. Florence Noble and the other members of her team serve as expert reviewers for different international journals and for several research agencies worldwide (e.g., Spain, Austria, Estonia, Belgium, Canada).

Since 2008, Florence Noble is Scientific deputy director of the Institute of biological science (INSB) of CNRS; members of the scientific committee of the scientific advisory Panel (as an expert in field of Addiction) of the ECNP (European College of Neuropsychopharmacology). She obtained several prizes including French National Academy of Pharmacy award(1993); Bronze Medal awarded by CNRS (1999); Royal Society (GB) Price 2002; "Coups d'élan pour la recherche française", Fondation Bettencourt-Schueller (2008). She is author of more that 120 peer reviewed articles.
